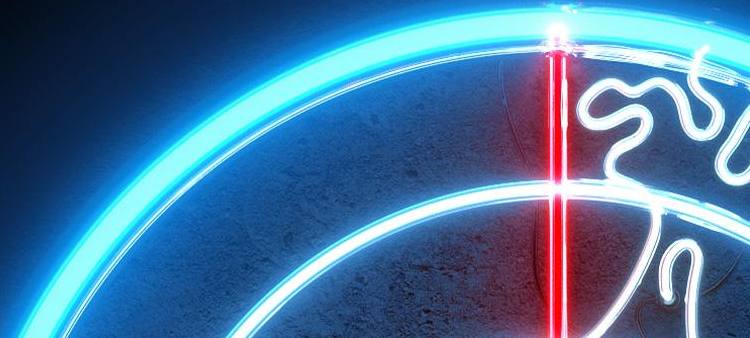

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OPCDEx: Challenging the current discourse

- Engagement in low-income countries to empower youth and local talent
 - This should **not** be seen through the lens of paternalism and power
 - but through **partnership & collaboration**
- Focus on knowledge transfer and capacity building
- Equality != Equity
 - Equality is treating everyone the same. Equity is giving everyone what they need to be successful.

OPCDEx: Challenging the current discourse

- We need to distance ourselves from the broken model of development that makes communities dependent on Western aid
- Partnership will provide a deeper understanding of the local challenges as well as empower local talents and provide opportunities
 - giving agency to the communities to inform us about their needs
- Empowering the youth in tech can be (for some) the only pathway to access employment.
 - can open opportunities to the needs in the global marketplace (exporting services)
- Learning more about often misrepresented countries and cultures

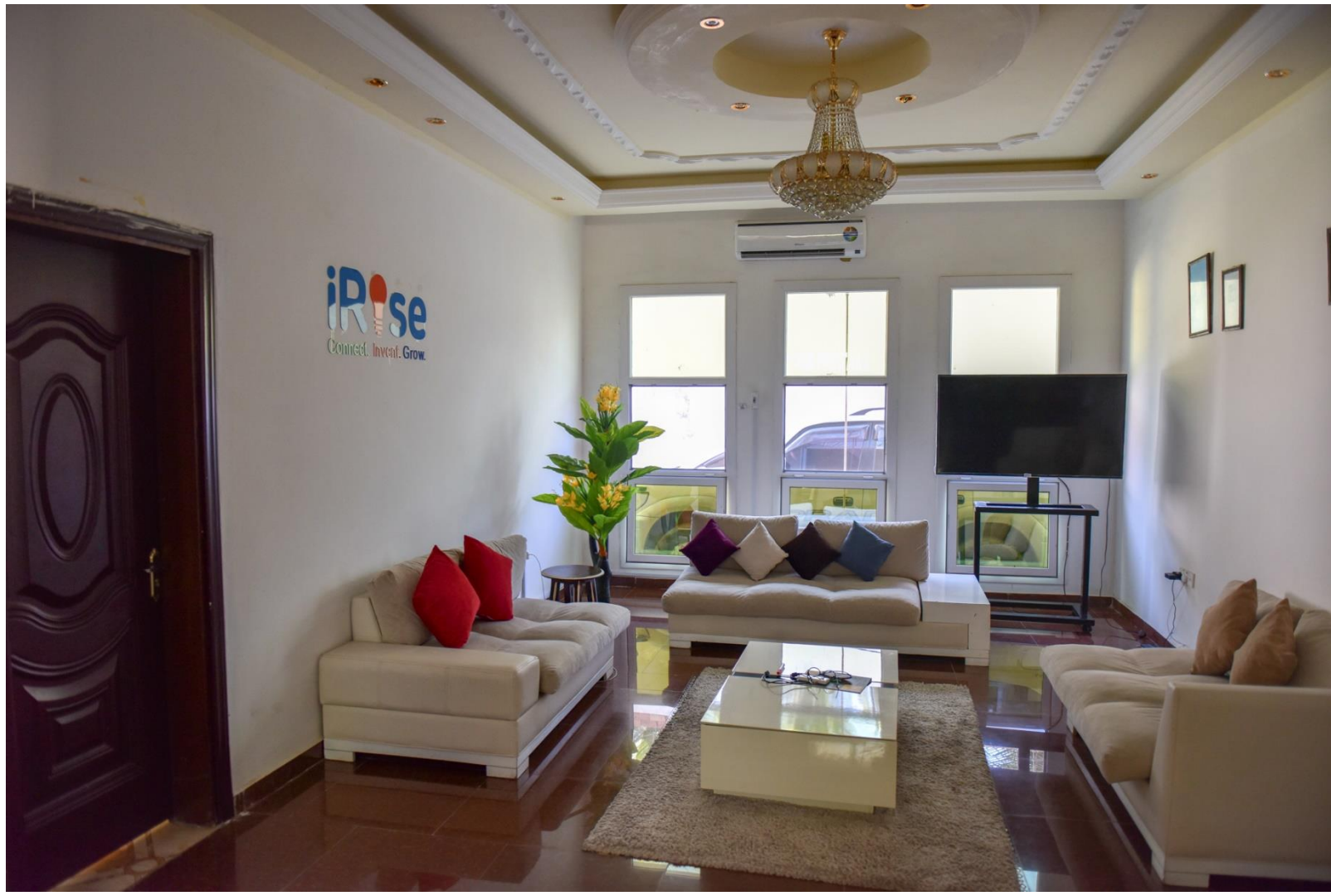

The importance of social impact

- Underrepresentation of women and ethnic minorities in tech in the US (and other Western countries) is widely debated;
 - focus should also be on the underrepresentation of global talent;
 - corporations and tech companies are **global in terms of impact**, so it's about time to include global representation in their workforce
- The tech industry can set the **standard** for inclusive environments and a diverse workforce, where global talent is highlighted instead of wasted
 - it will have a positive ripple effect on the economy as a whole in low-income countries
 - making this the **most sustainable model** for development to tackle other **global** issues
